Laluk College at a glance

Laluk College was established in 1985. The college has been affiliated to Madhabdev University. The college was registered under section 2(f) and 12(B) of the UGC Act. 1956 on 13th June, 2007 and 2nd November, 2010 respectively. On 20th January, 2014 the college was provincialised by the Govt. of Assam w.e.f. 01-01-2013. NAAC Peer Team visited the college on 4th and 5th February 2020 and the college has been accredited with Grade "B"(CGPA-2.15) on 14th Feb. 2020.

The college awards Bachelors of Arts degree. It has about 700 enrolment of students, 33 permanent teaching staff excluding part time teachers and the college is efficiently supported by 11 Non-teaching staff. The College offers B.A. Programme in accordance with National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 under Madhabdev University.

Semester Duration:

i) Odd Semesters: June –November (including end-semester examinations and semester breaks)
 ii) Even Semester: December -May (including end-semester examinations and semester breaks)
 Any change in the Academic Calendar/Schedule may be made by the University whenever necessary.

Extent of Application

The Regulations shall be applicable to the students enrolled for the Courses of Study leading to the Bachelor Programme in Arts (BA) which shall be of four years duration under FYUGP as per NEP:2020.

Academic Schedule:

The Academic Schedule of the Bachelor degrees in Arts (BA) Programmes under the NEP 2020 shall be administered as per the Academic Calendar of the University published for every academic session.

Admission Criteria:

- (i) The minimum eligibility for admission into the following Programmes shall be as below: Bachelor of Arts (B.A.): A student passed the Higher Secondary Examination (10+2) of the Assam Higher Secondary Education Council, or an equivalent examination (10+2) recognized as such by the University.
- (ii) The admission or eligibility criteria shall be fixed by the Academic Council from time to time whenever necessary as per Govt. and University notifications and guidlines time to time.
 (iii) No student shall be eligible for admission to an Academic Programme in any discipline unless he/she has successfully passed the qualifying examination fulfilling the minimum eligibility criteria from a University /Institute recognized by Madhabdev University.
- (iv) Statutory reservation policy of the government shall be followed in case of selection of eligible candidates for admission.
- (v) The College offers Fee waiver Scheme of the Govt. of Assam for the students as per Govt. Norms and Guidlines.

Course Enrolment

The minimum and maximum credits to be opted by a student for qualifying of a graduate degree shall be as per the Course Structure given in the details of the courses. Change of Courses shall not be permitted after sending the records of the students to the University for registration.

Attendance

The course teacher shall be responsible for maintaining a record of attendance of students who have enrolled for the course.

All course teachers shall intimate the Principal/ Director of a college/ Institute through the Head of the Department concerned at least thirty calendar days before the last instruction day in the

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semester, the particulars of all students who have less than 80% of attendance during the total number of class days.

A student who has less than 80% attendance in average shall not be permitted to sit for the Endsemester examination. Provided that it shall be open to the University to grant exemption to a student who has attended a minimum of 70% classes but failed to obtain the prescribed 80% attendance for valid reasons, on recommendation of the Head/Chairperson/Principal of College on payment of a prescribed fee(s).

Examination and Evaluation:

- (a) Examination and evaluation shall be done on a continuous basis, at least three times during each semester.
- (b) There shall be 30% marks for internal assessment and 70% marks for End-semester examination in each course during every semester.
- (c) There shall be no provision for re-evaluation of the answer-scripts of the end-semester examinations. However, a candidate may apply for re-scrutiny.

(d) Internal Assessment:

- (i) In internal assessment, different tools such as objective tests, written tests, assignments, paper presentation, laboratory work, etc. suitable to the courses may be employed.
- (ii) The students shall be informed in advance about the nature of assessment. Students shall be required to compulsorily attend internal assessment including appearing the Sessional Tests, failing which they will not be allowed to appear for the End-semester examination. A Student cannot repeat In-semester examinations. The department may arrange special in-semester examination whenever necessary.

(e) End Semester Examination:

- (i) There shall be one End semester examination carrying 70% Marks in each course of a Semester covering the entire syllabus prescribed for the Course. The End semester examination is normally a written/laboratory-based examination/Project Work/Dissertation
- (ii) The Controller of Examinations shall make necessary arrangements for notifying the dates of the End semester examinations and other procedures as per University Rules (at least 20 days in advance) and the Academic Calendar notified by the University.
- (iii) Normally, the End-semester examination for each course shall be of three hour duration.
- (g) The mode of the conduct of the end-semester examinations of the practical/ dissertation courses shall be partially external as below:
 - The end-semester examinations of all practical/dissertation courses shall be conducted by a Board of Examiners consisting of the internal examiner (the concerned course teacher) and an external examiner appointed by the Controller of Examinations.
 - 2. A student shall not be allowed to take more than one project work in a single semester.
- (h) The mode of end-semester examination and evaluation of the Course shall be specified in the detailed syllabus of the Course concerned.
- (i) End-semester Practical examinations shall normally be held before the theory examinations.

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Results and Progression:

a) A candidate shall be declared as passed a course, provided he/ she secures-

Minimum pass marks both in Internal and End semester Examination as per norms of Madhabdev University.

- b) A candidate shall be declared as passed a semester/ programme, provided he/ she secures at least 'P' grade in the 10 point scale (given in clause) in all the Courses separately.
- c) There may be moderation of Internal Assessment marks/End Semester marks as and when necessary.
- d) The marks of In-semester examinations obtained by the candidate shall be carried over for declaring any result.
- e) A candidate will be awarded certificate, Diploma or Degree by Madhabdev University
 after qualifying the required semester level exams as per curriculum framework of Madhabdev
 University.
- f) Since the Semester system involves continuous assessment, there shall be no scope for a student to appear as a private candidate in any programme in this system.

Grading System:

The absolute grading system shall be applied in evaluating performance of the students.

The following scale of grading system shall be applied to indicate the performances of students in terms of letter grade and grade points as given below:

The Letter grade 'B+' and above shall be considered as First Class and Letter grade 'B' shall be considered as Second Class.

A student is considered to have completed a course successfully and earned the prescribed credits if he/she secures a letter grade other than F (Failed) or 'Abs' (Absent/Incomplete).

If a candidate secures 'F' grade in a Course, he/she shall have to reappear in the Course in the next legitimate chance.

If a student secures 'F' grade in Project Work/ Dissertation/ assignment etc., he/she shall have to re-submit it after necessary revisions. The Result shall be declared with next regular batch.

'Abs' grade shall be awarded to a candidate if he/she has not fulfilled the following requirements:
(i) If a candidate fails to appear in any Course(s) in an end semester examination. (ii) If a candidate fails to submit the project work/dissertation / assignment of an end semester examination. (iii) If a candidate is certified as not eligible to appear in any course(s) in an end semester examination by the Course Teacher(s) due to insufficient attendance in lectures, tutorials, practical or field works. 8.8 The candidates not appearing in a Semester Examination shall be considered as an 'Abs' candidate and that will be reflected in the Grade Sheet of the candidate. These candidate shall have to convert the 'Abs' grade by appearing in the next examination on the Course (provided he/she has legitimate chance to appear the Course) concerned or by submitting project work/dissertation/assignment etc. 8.9 Results of the candidates appeared in the Betterment or Backlog Examinations shall not be counted for the award of Prizes/Medals, Rank or Distinction.

Transcript

The University may issue consolidated Transcript on payment of a prescribed fee which shall contain Letter grades, grade points and SGPA and CGPA mentioning the Course Titles in details, medium of instruction and programme duration.

Credit Transfer

Credit transfer is done as per NEP 2020 and affiliating Madhabdev University.





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Rules for Internal Assesment in B.A. Programmes in Semester System

Out total of 100 marks, 70 marks and 30 marks are alloted for End Semester and In semester Examinations respectively. Out of 30 In semester assessment, 20marks are alloted for two sessional Examinations and anothed 10 marks are alloted for seminer/GD/I.A.and attendance.

setting of question paper, invigilation dury, evaluation of answer scripts for each paper shall be done by the concerned teacher(s) as a part of his/her/their normal duty. The teacher concerned shall fix the date of the sessional examination of each course complying with the Academic Calendar of the University. 3. The students shall have to write the answers in the scripts provided and duly authenticated by the college/ institute concerned. 4. After evaluation, the answer scripts should be shown to the students and corrections should be made if necessary. After this, the answer scripts should be collected back from the students. 5. There shall be no provision for "repeat"/ "betterment" in the sessional examination. If a student misses any sessional examination for unavoidable reasons, the concerned teacher may allow the student to appear in a separate examination at his/her own discretion. 6. The marks of internal assessment secured by a candidate shall be carried over to next legitimate chances. 7. If a course is taught by more than one teacher then the concerned teachers shall conduct the process of internal assessment together.

6. If any student fails to appear in internal assessment, he/she shall not be eligible to appear in the end semester examinations of the course(s) concerned. The colleges/ institutes shall notify the same prior to filling up forms for examinations. 7. At the end of the semester (before the end-semester examinations begin) the concerned College shall submit the internal assessment marks in proper format to the University. 8. The University may call the answer scripts from the colleges/ institute at any time during the academic sessions. ****

Admission Process

Online application for admission into B.A. 1st semester under FYUGP will be opened in the Samarth Portal, Govt. of Assam. The candidates seeking admission in B.A. 1st semester will have to log on the link for admission. A student, who has passed the higher secondary Examination (10+2) from AHSEC or any other Examination considered as equivalent by the Board or University concerned shall be eligible for admission into B.A. 1st sem classes under FYUGP. The candidate must upload all the required copies of testimonials like mark sheet, Pass certificate of last higher secondary examination, caste certificate etc. as indicated in application form. However, the admission is completely free as per order, govt. of Assam.

General Guidelines for Admission

- Addmission will be in online mode under Samarth Admission Portal of Govt. of Assam.(link- https://assamadmission.samarth.ac.in)
- Admission will be on merit basis.
- For submission of application form and admission in B.A course (1st sem), visit Samarth Admission Portal, Govt. of Assam.

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- Student, who passed H.S Examination earlier than the current year, will have to submit Gap Certificate/Affidavit for entire gap period showing candidates pre-occupation and non-indulgence in any criminal activity after leaving the last institute.
- No student will be allowed to pursue the course while doing a job.
- Candidates must upload his/her admit card, mark sheet of last higher secondary examination, caste certificate and other required testimonials as indicated in the application form, available in the Samarth Admission Portal, Govt. of Assam.


